

MODS AGM 2023 – Board Candidates

The following is the list of board candidates running for election at the 2023 MODS AGM. There are a total of 6 vacancies to be filled and 10 candidates. Our By-Laws require that the board have a 5:4 gender split (with consideration made for non-binary candidates).

At each AGM, membership elects the number of board candidates that will fill the current vacancies. The elected board then determines among themselves who will fill the officer positions (President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer) on an annual basis. Each board member elected at the AGM serves a 2year term.

The 3 board members returning for the second year of their 2-year terms are:

- Robin Merasty (she/her)
- Eric Robert incumbent Treasurer (he/him)
- Charlotte Thrift incumbent Secretary (she/her)

Given that there are only 2 female board candidates seeking election, they will both be elected by acclimation to ensure that the board composition satisfies the by-law requirement. The vote at the AGM will include the 8 male candidates, with 4 spots available on the board.

During her past 2 terms serving on the MODS board, Kari has been actively working on the Governance Committee, reviewing and updating policies, and helped advocate for some new initiatives including Gender Ratio A. She has served on multiple committees and was instrumental in formalizing MODS' latest strategic direction. Her dedication, insight, and hard work have proven that she is an asset to the MODS Board of Directors.

Trinh Nguyen-Lu (she/her)*

Trinh Nguyen-Lu seeks to join the Manitoba Organization of Disc Sports (MODS) as a potential board member. Her journey in ultimate began in the summer of 2015 when she co-founded a co-ed recreational league team with friends.

Over the years, Trinh has been actively involved in various levels of co-ed and women's programming, including indoor and outdoor teams, women's developmental, advanced, and elite teams, indoor parity leagues, and local tournaments. Notably, she recently represented Manitoba at the 2023 Canadian Ultimate Championships – Masters as a member of the Winnipeg Prairie Sky team.

Trinh's leadership and administrative skills have developed significantly since graduating from the University of Manitoba in 2014 as a Registered Nurse. She has advocated for patients in various healthcare settings, including the Emergency Department, Intensive Care Unit, and The Minor Illness and Injury Clinic. Currently pursuing a PhD in Nursing at the University of Manitoba, Trinh plays an active role in the Graduate Nursing Students' Association, serving as Secretary for the 2021-2022 academic year and chairing several sub-committees. She also acts as the Nursing Graduate Student Representative within various university committees.

Recognizing the importance of inclusivity, equity, and accessibility in program development, Trinh is dedicated to upholding these principles within MODS. As a board member, she is committed to fostering clear, transparent, and timely communication.
